Ghyll Head Trip

This year's year 6 residential trip to Ghyll Head Outdoor Education Centre in the Lake District will take place 21-23 May 2025. The trip for the following academic year, which is for the current year 5 pupils to attend when they are in year 6, will take place 20 -22 May 2026.

The children will spend two nights, three days away in the Lake District at the Manchester City Council Outdoor Centre; trained instructors will take groups out for various activities during each day. The course involves a wide range of outdoor physical activities some of which will include abseiling, canoeing, caving, gorge-walking and orienteering. This is a valuable opportunity for the children to experience adventurous activities in a magnificent setting. Skills such as working as part of a team and communicating will be drawn on during the days and they will keep up a reflective log of the events.



Eco Information

Just a reminder, that our eco-uniform rail is still up and running in the hanger area. Too frequently, uniforms that are in good condition can be thrown away because they no longer fit their child. However, this is wasteful and harmful to the environment as the majority of school uniforms are still in wearable condition for other children. Recycling them is an excellent way to reduce waste, help the community, save money and help the environment. With World Book Day coming up on Thursday 6th March 2025, many are thinking about which of their favourite book characters they will be dressing up as this year. We will be adding an extra eco- rail after the half term holiday for a fancy dress costume swap, offering families the opportunity to donate costumes and/or collect another costume to take home. Rights Respecting

As part of our Rights Respecting Outright campaign 2025, the children have been discussing what it means to be a global citizen. We think that a global citizen can be defined as someone who believes in global justice and acts to make the world a safer, fairer and more sustainable place in which human rights are protected and respected. We talked about ways that the children at St Paul's protect the world such as banning micro plastics, recycling and reusing our school uniforms, Christmas jumpers etc

Try one of our popular school lunch menu items ... Minestrone Soup - 25 portions


| Vegetable Oil | 30ml | Green Cabbage | 500g |
|---------------|------|--------------------|------------|
| Onions | 400g | Chopped Tomatoes | 640g |
| Celery | 90g | Garlic Powder | 1 tspn |
| Red Lentils | 300g | Mixed Herbs | 2 tspn |
| Carrots | 500g | Spaghetti | 200g |
| Swede | 500g | Water | 3ltr 500ml |
| Potatoes | 500g | Vegetable Bouillon | 90g |

Method

- 1. Prepare and finely dice all the vegetables
- 2. Heat the oil and soften onions without colouring
- 3. Add the celery, carrot, swede, potato and lentils together with the water, vegetable bouillon, herbs and garlic powder. Bring to the boil and simmer, gently stirring occasionally until the vegetables are almost cooked
- 4. Break the dry spaghetti into small pieces that will fit on a spoon
- 5. Add the chopped tomatoes, cabbage and spaghetti pieces, return to a simmer until the spaghetti is cooked
- 6. Additional water may be required
- 7. Adjust seasoning


Chinese New Year
