As the minimum age for joining Twitter is 13, St Paul's children should not have their own account.

Rights Respecting – Right of the Month Article 13

Article 13 (freedom of expression) Every child must be free to express their thoughts and opinions and to access all kinds of information, as long as it is within the law.

Everyone has the human right to express themselves, and Article 13 of the UNCRC makes it clear that this includes children and young people. Part of this right of freedom of expression involves being able to find out information for yourself— so you're able to share it in the way you want.

You could discuss these points with your children:

- Why is it important to be able to share our views freely?
- How can we find out reliable information?
- Do we have the right to our own opinion?
- Are we allowed to have different opinions from our family/ friends?
- Why is it important to be respectful when putting our views across and listening to others?
- Do all children have the freedom of expression? Can you think of any children who may find this hard? (eg using language, being heard etc)

GOOGLE CLASSROOM

1. Open your web browser and access www.google.co.uk
2. Go to the top right of screen and click sign in.
3. Sign in using your log in details.
4. If this is your first-time logging in please agree to the term and conditions.
5. Using the square of dots (app grid) on the top right of screen – click – open classroom application.
6. Click on your year group (if this is your first time click join).
7. Go to classwork – find the work to want to complete.
8. When handing in work – click on 'turn in work' found at the top right
8. Log out at the end of the session by clicking on the letter P (top right) and finding sign

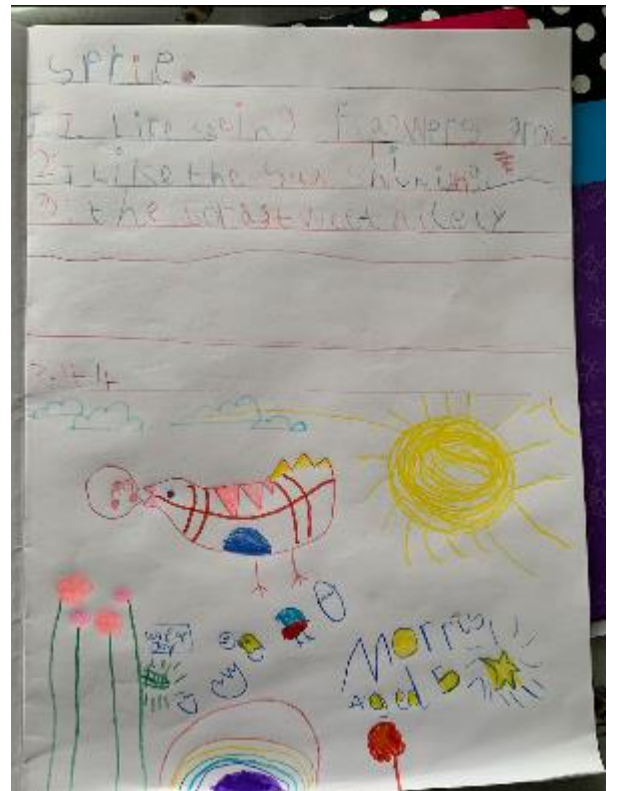
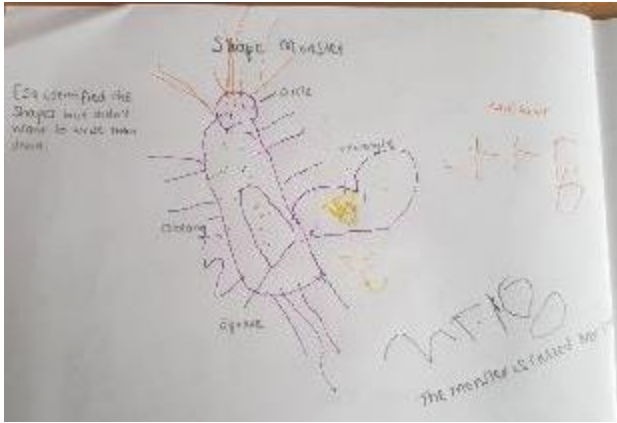
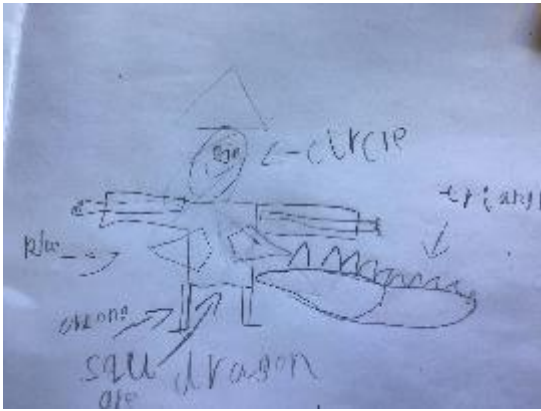
SCHOOL WEBSITE

Earth Day Poem

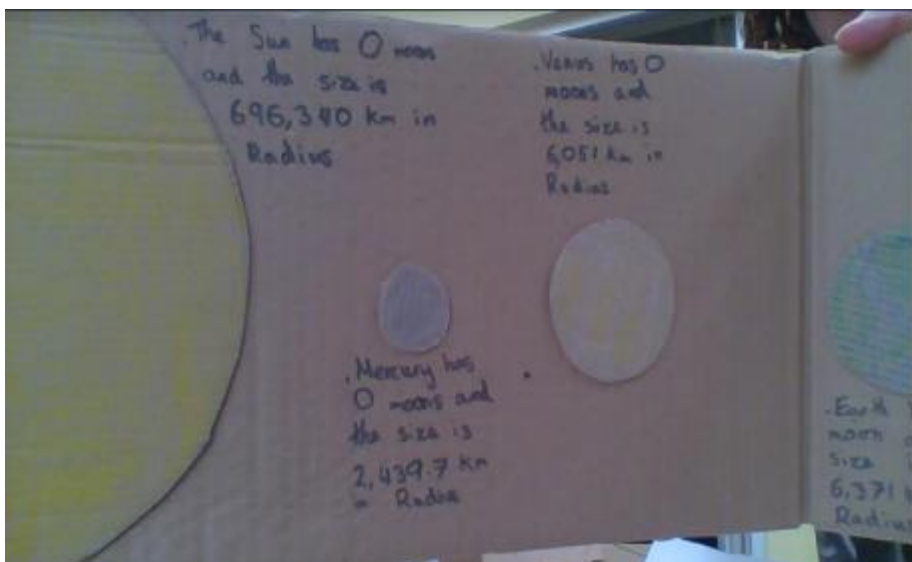
Every-thing deserves a home,

The Solar System

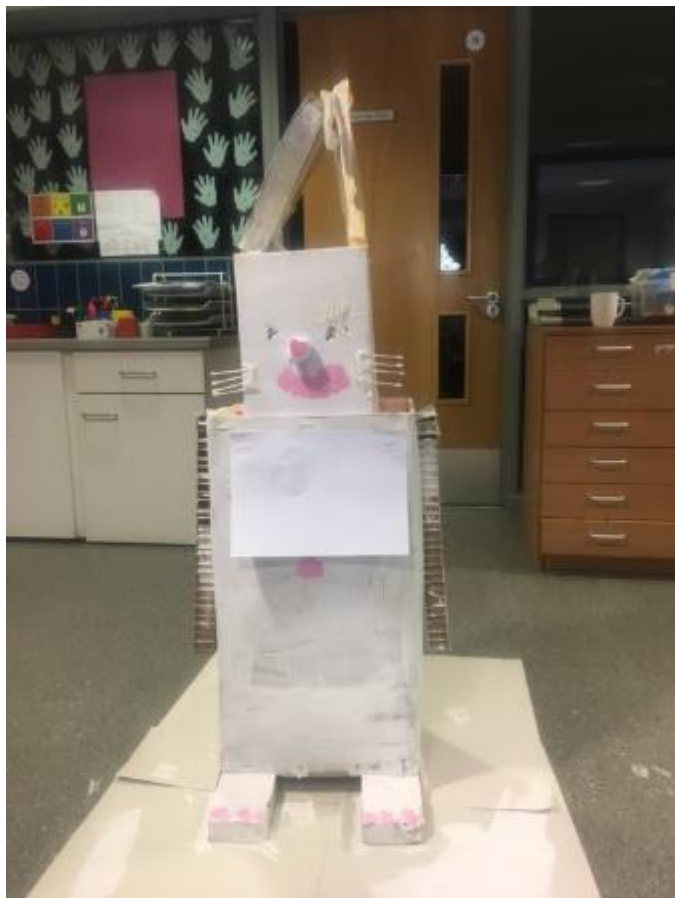


MY VERY ELEGANT MOTHER JUST SAT UPON NINE PORCUPINES
