



# Year 6 Summer Term



**This letter is for all year 6 parents including those not returning on June 9<sup>th</sup>.**

Welcome back Year 6

We are looking forward to seeing lots of our year 6 pupils on the 9<sup>th</sup> June. Below is some information that follows on from the letter Ms Sorohan sent you on Monday.

The plan below has been created with wellbeing in mind, and decisions made to ensure the transition back into school is as smooth and enjoyable as possible. We aim to build pupil confidence during this half term, enabling them to have closure on their time at St Paul's and begin to plan and prepare for the transition into their exciting next stage of education. Alongside the wellbeing elements of the daily routine we will be teaching identified key objectives from the national curriculum we have identified as the foundations to all maths and English learning plus the skills that run through all curriculum areas including comprehension, research, organisation and cross curricular general knowledge.

I hope the information makes it clear how the year 6 bubbles and day will run.

## How do we come into school?

Pupils will arrive between 8.45- 8.55 and will come down St Paul's road on the right hand side or the passage off Wilmslow Road again on the right hand side, the road will be closed off to cars and year 6 children need to be left at the end of the roads, to ensure social distancing. The path will be a one-way system and pupils will wait on 2m distanced markers to be welcomed into school by a member of the leadership team through the main entrance. At this point pupils will be told which bubble (class) they will go to and will be given hand sanitiser. Pupils will wash their hands once settled into their bubbles.

Pupils will walk through the school using a one-way system and will take all coats and packed lunches into their rooms.

The photo below shows how the children will come into the school.





### **Bubbles and classrooms**

The pupils will be placed in a bubble which has been chosen to ensure they are confident and happy during this time. Within the bubble there will be 2 members of St Paul's staff which will remain the same each day. The staff will supervise the bubble at all times during the school day including break and lunchtimes.

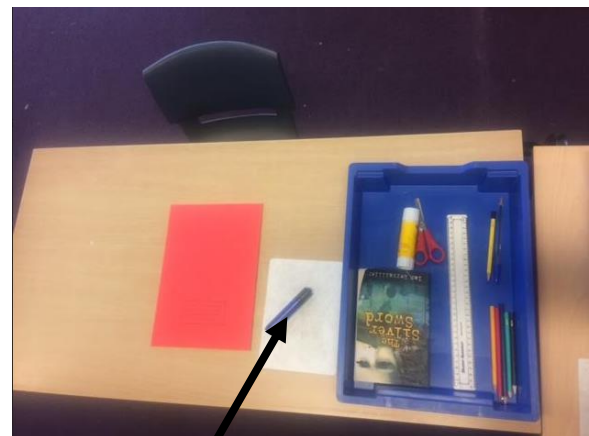
The children will be sat at L shaped tables (see below) that are placed at a distance of 2m and will all have their own equipment (see below) needed for the day, children will sit at the same table every day.

The pupils will stay in their bubble for break and lunch and will have their own set of equipment which will be wiped down after each use. Pupils will eat in their bubbles in the classroom and then will go outside for the rest of their lunchtime.

Pupils will use the toilets at the end of the year 6 corridor and will only use them one person at a time, they will be supervised washing hands after each visit.



### **Year 6 pupils not returning to school**

For those pupils not returning to school the on line google classroom will still be provided, this will look differently from the 9<sup>th</sup> June as work will be under year 6 and year 5 NOT under the set teacher names. Pupils will be provided with 5 English and 5 Maths a week alongside 1 Geography, Art and Science. There will be less feedback from teachers during this stage of on-line learning.

### **Cleanliness and Hygiene**

The school will be cleaned thoroughly every evening and on Friday.

Each room will have a set of cleaning products that can be used for wiping indoor/outdoor equipment.

Each room has a pedal bin and tissues.

Pupils will wash their hands a minimum of 4 times a day at relevant points.

### **Uniform**

Year 6 will be expected to wear uniform and bring a labelled water bottle into school.

### **At the end of the day**

The children will be taken to the main entrance at 3.15 end where we are hoping they will make their own way home (this will support their confidence in transition to high school), if they are collected parents will need to wait on the spaced out markers where their child will be taken to them.

We realise the thought of returning to school may be both daunting and exciting and hope the information above helps prepare your child for their return.
