'Being Open About Mental Health'- a workshop for Parents and Carers



Following our successful Mental Health Week; Growing together, we would like to invite parents and carers to an Open Afternoon; 'Being Open about Mental Health' on Tuesday 8th March at 2.30pm. This is a child led afternoon where the children will be informing parents and carers about the important five steps to wellbeing. Some children from Key Stage 2 will be leading information stalls about being active, connecting, being kind, learning and taking notice.

The Rights Respecting Rangers will be informing parents about how they are supporting St Paul's in gaining the gold award as a Rights Respecting School, linking children's rights to mental health. The event will take place in the hall and in the playground, showcasing all the hard work St Paul's children have contributed to raising awareness about good Mental Health, for children, parents and carers.

Rights Respecting School Award

We are now on our journey to achieving the Gold Status for being a Rights Respecting School. As part of this, the children have been learning that because they have special children's rights they are known as 'Rights Holders'. It is the job of adults to ensure children have their rights met and so they are known as 'Duty Bearers'. All adults who care for children are Duty Bearers. So, you as a parent / career are a Duty Bearer as are all the staff in school. We have made displays around the school to show children this like this one in Early Years. Mindfulness Workshop - Mental Health Week

The children learned how to focus on mindful listening which allowed the brain to declutter and calm.
