A day where we can all think about our impact on the world's oceans and the creatures that live there.</p> <p>Can you name any Oceans of the world? (Use a map/globe to show them to the group)</p> <p><u>Why are Oceans important?</u></p> <p>The ocean produces at least 50% of the planet's oxygen, it is home to most of earth's biodiversity, and is the main source of protein for more than a billion people around the world. Even though all its benefits, the ocean is now in need of support. With 90% of big fish populations gone and 50% of coral reefs destroyed, we are taking more from the ocean than can be replenished. We must act now to save our oceans and the future of sea life.</p>

What can we do to help?

At St Pauls, we are on a journey to become an Eco School and as part of this important work we are doing we will no longer be using glitter in schools. Why? Glitter is a microplastic and ends up in our water supply and environment. This week the Green Team will be collecting all the glitter in the school to send off to a Glitter Amnesty charity that will use the donated glitter to encase in art installations so it cannot end up in the environment.
